CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENT


We expect our students to take pride in their work, their appearance and what they have accomplished. They must develop self-accomplishment. They must develop self-discipline and show courtesy towards everyone in school and community. Our constant endeavour is to realize this dream.

STUDENTS MUST ...

- Be regular and punctual
- Report in complete school uniform
- Carry notebooks and assignments as per the time table
- Respect teachers through courteous language and conduct
- Use decent language
- Fall in a line when moving out of class
- Switch off the lights and fans when not in use
- Maintain school property
- Complete the school work and assignments on time
- Carry school almanac daily
- Keep pace with fellow friends/teacher in doing class work
- Be responsible for any work missed in class due to absence
- Return to class from PF/Library/ Labs and other outdoor periods on time

STUDENTS MUST NOT...

- Use indecent language
- Bully others
- Damage school property
- Play or run in the class
- Run in the corridors
- Be late in reporting to class
- Be late in submission of work
- Bunk classes
- Bring mobiles, valuables and heavy cash to school
- Litter class or school
- Eat or drink during teaching periods
- Use unfair means during examinations
- Carry or wear accessories to school



GENERAL GUIDELINES TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. **Any communication made by the parent / guardian should be addressed to the Principal.** The (Address and Phone No.) Name, Admission No., Class and Section of the child should be clearly mentioned in the application.
2. Parents are requested not to enter the classrooms or make telephone calls to contact or to see their children / teachers during school hours.
3. Any change in the Residential Address, Telephone Number or other vital information should be promptly intimated in writing to the school.
4. **For security reasons, leave for half day should not be asked for.**
5. Children, when sick should not be sent to school to attend classes. If they fall sick on the day of assessment they may be sent to the school but if they seek permission to go back home after taking up the test, the same shall be granted if the School Nurse agrees that there is a need for the same.
6. Parent's attention is drawn to the fact that criticism of the school or teacher in the presence of a child should be scrupulously avoided because it causes the students to lose respect for the teachers with the consequent failure to learn from them. It also retards their progress.
7. In case of a legitimate complaint, the parents must meet the Principal at the earliest. The complaint will be personally verified.
8. Parents are required to co-operate with the school in its attempt to help their children progress by paying attention to their regularity, punctuality and discipline and taking keen interest in their work. **(They should check the Almanac every day and note the homework and other instructions given. They are advised to check the bags of their wards to see if any circular / notice / invitation has been issued).**
9. Care must be taken of all school property and if any damage is done, it will be made good by the student concerned together with a fine imposed for the damage.
10. Students are not allowed to wear earrings. Girls are not allowed to wear small tops / studs. No student is allowed to put on nail polish / mehendi / tattoos **under any circumstance in the name of marriage, Rakhi etc.**
11. Students are advised not to bring valuable articles e.g. expensive watches, fountain pens, transistors, cameras, calculators or jewellery to school. In case of loss of valuables or other articles, the authorities will try their best to trace the items out but shall not undertake any responsibility for the loss.
12. All students are expected to join the school on the notified date at the beginning of the term or after each vacation.
13. The ward of those parents who would avoid meeting the authorities, when advised to do so, may not be allowed to attend the classes.
14. **Parents should not try to contact the teachers over the phone, but they can meet the teachers on prior appointment.**

GENERAL GUIDELINES TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

15. Parents and guardians will appreciate that absence during the term is not in the best interest of the student. Parents are asked not to apply for leave if avoidable.

Leave can be granted to the students only on the following grounds :

- In case of serious illness or death of a very near relative.
 - For a condolence visit, if the student is the only male member of the family, where custom so demands.
 - To attend the marriage of his / her real brother, sister, uncle or aunt.
16. Parents must first consult the school calendar, date sheets and other circulars before making enquiries over the phone.
17. No student is allowed to bring sweets, presents etc. to school to mark his / her / other's birthday or any other occasion. However if they want to celebrate, they might do so only by distributing limited number of quality chocolates.
18. Parents are requested not to enter the school buses to see off and receive their wards.
19. Parents should not try to overtake and stop the school bus to facilitate the boarding of their wards as this endangers their safety.
20. Parents should not argue with the teachers present in the bus or the conductor / driver. If there is any problem, a written complaint should be given to the Principal.
21. Parents are requested not to send any non - vegetarian food including egg preparations to school. Only nutritious, healthy food should be packed in the tiffin boxes.
22. Check the haircut, uniform and punctuality of your ward in the morning.
23. Make your ward converse in English even at home, which is very important for the improvement of their conversational skills and also for the atmosphere of the school.
24. Students should observe polite manners whenever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct.
25. The Name, Class & Section of the student should be clearly marked on all belongings including blazer etc.
26. School appointees should wear their respective badges everyday.

Parents and guardians are requested to read and explain the school rules to their wards.

SCHOOL RULES

1. **Every student should carry his / her Almanac to school every day.**
2. Parents are requested to avail the school bus facility to commute their wards to the school. Non bus commuters should arrive at school 10 minutes before the start of the Home Room Period.
3. In the morning, the warning bell rung 5 minutes before the start of **Home Room Period**, is a signal for all students to go to their respective class rooms. This should be done promptly and in silence. As soon as they are in their classes, students must get ready for the assembly / period.
4. Change of class rooms between periods should be done in silence and in an orderly manner.
5. **Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. Students who are not in proper uniform will not be allowed to enter their class rooms.**
6. Non Sikh boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals. Hair cut should be a simple boy cut. Girls with long hair must tie it up neatly into plaits.
7. No shouting or whistling is allowed in or around the school building. Running in corridors is strictly prohibited.
8. It is strictly forbidden to throw any object at any one.
9. No child should damage/spoil the school property or the property of other children. Any such damage shall be made good by the parents. Intentional damage may lead to termination.
10. Any damage done will be made good by the student concerned, together with a heavy fine imposed on him/her for such an offence. Any one who notices something damaged, should report the matter even if he or she does not know who has done it.
11. Students are not allowed to bring sharp instruments or valuables to the school.
12. No book, (other than textbooks or library books) magazine or paper may be brought to the school without the Class teacher's permission.
13. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not permitted.
14. Students who come to school in the care of attendants should never leave the school premises before the attendant arrives. In case of delay, they should report to the school office. Those who go home alone should not loiter about on the way but be prompt in returning home straight. Students are warned not to buy or receive anything from anyone, on way home or to school.
15. Our students should observe and follow polite manners wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct. They should greet their teachers whenever and wherever they meet them.
16. **The school reserves for itself the right to terminate the students with unsatisfactory progress in studies or whose conduct is a bad influence for others.**
17. Exploding crackers or splashing colours during Diwali / Holi or any other occasion in the school premises or school buses is strictly forbidden. Non - compliance of these instructions can result in expulsion from the school.
18. Students should attend festivals and functions celebrated in the school.
19. **Students are not allowed to carry mobile phones or any electronic gadget to the school.** Stern action (that might lead to expulsion) will be taken against students violating this rule.
20. **Students must come to school in uniform only. This rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes or even after school hours.**
21. **Wearing low waist trousers and skirts is not allowed.**
22. If any child does not come in proper uniform, he/she will be sent back home (With parents) after the third warning for which parents will receive a call from the school to pick their ward and child will be marked absent for the day.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

1. No student who has been absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class until the parent sends a written application, addressed to the Principal stating the reason for leave.
2. A student, returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a doctor's fitness certificate permitting him to do so. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to School :

Chicken Pox	Till the scabs fall completely.
Cholera	Till the child has completely recovered.
Measles	Two weeks after the rash disappears.
Mumps	Until the swelling has gone; about one month.
Whooping Cough	Six weeks
Jaundice	Six weeks
Conjunctivitis	One week

3. Students who require medical attention during school hours, will be sent to home/medical facility.
4. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than three consecutive days renders the student liable to have his name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted only after payment of a fresh admission fee.
5. All students are expected to attend school on the opening day after the vacations. Absence of four days without permission after a vacation would lead to getting the name of the child struck off the rolls.
6. It is compulsory for the students to complete 75% of attendance in each term to make them eligible to take the Assessment / Examination.

LATE ARRIVAL IN SCHOOL

1. The school gate is closed 5 minutes after the commencement of the school. (School Hours mentioned on page 8.)
2. Students arriving late will not be allowed to enter the school.
3. Necessary disciplinary action will be taken against habitual late comers.

ADMISSION / WITHDRAWAL / TERMINATION / EXPULSION

Admission :

- A child seeking admission to the school must first get his or her name registered after getting the prospectus from the school.
- Admission to school is considered on the basis of age, merit and vacancy.
- The school reserves the right to grant admission to a student.
- If at a later date, it is found that the information provided to the school is fake or incorrect, the admission will be cancelled.

Withdrawal :

1. One clear calendar month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice must be given before the pupil is withdrawn.
2. Those who leave school during the session must in all cases pay the fees for the month last attended.
3. Transfer Certificate is not issued until all the dues of the school are settled.
4. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds :
 - Disciplinary
 - Unsatisfactory progress in studies.
 - Detention / repeated detentions in a class.
5. The school espouses politeness in talk and behaviour as a special aspect of education. Any rude / impolite behaviour towards staff members in / outside the school by any student / parent / guardian shall be sufficient reason for the immediate expulsion of the student from the school rolls.

T. C./Other Certified copies :

A T. C. is issued only on payment of Rs. 300/- .Duplicate copy of T. C. is not ordinarily issued. In special cases, the certificate can be issued after verification and only on payment of Rs. 300/- as Duplicate Certificate Fee.

Request for other certified copies is to be made through a written notice given one week in advance.

We wish to offer a congenial environment for healthy discussion on programmes to be implemented and also to be able to reach out to the entire parent body through representatives of the PTA.


The need is to work for child's overall holistic progress bridging the gap between the school and the parent. For this need the PTA would support and improve the educational as well as social activities of children and would also direct the frequency of communication of ideas and information between the school and home.

Note :

1. In case of urgency, the parents can meet the Teacher/Co-ordinator/Principal at any time with prior appointment or as per availability of the Teacher/Co-ordinator/Principal.
2. No PTM's will be done during Mid-Term and Annual Examinations and during Vacations.



SCHOOL TRANSPORT

Students can avail the school transport subject to the availability of seats. The routes of the school transport are drawn up and the parents should consult the School Transport Incharge for necessary details.

The School reserves the right towards providing transport facility to the students.

Transport RULES :

1. A student using the school transport is expected to be at the bus stop at least five minutes before the scheduled arrival of the vehicle. The student has to be on the correct side of the arriving vehicle.
2. Students are allowed to use only the allotted vehicle and their stop. No change can be allowed without the prior permission of the school in writing.
3. If a student misses his allotted vehicle he should not try to board any other vehicle. It is the responsibility of the parent to drop their ward at the school gate. However the student will return by the allotted vehicle.
4. The transport will not wait for late comers.
5. The students should stay away from the main road until their vehicle arrives.
6. No student should come near the entry door of the vehicle until it comes to a complete halt. The front door of the vehicle is the only authorized entrance and exit.
7. Boarding and alighting from the vehicle should be done in silence and in an orderly manner.
8. All students must occupy vacant seats immediately after boarding their respective vehicles. Reservation of seats for co-commuters is not allowed under any circumstance.
9. No student should travel standing on the footboard.
10. Students must not move around in the vehicle when it is in motion.
11. The students must make sure that the aisle of the vehicle is clear, school bags and other belongings are placed properly.
12. Students must be seated in the vehicle. They should not put even their hands out for waving.
13. No object should be discarded inside or thrown outside the vehicle.
14. Consumption of edibles is not permitted in the vehicles.
15. Unruly behaviour like shrieking, shouting and playing mischief is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected at all times.
16. The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.
17. If, due to certain exigency, a student has to leave the school campus during school hours, by his own transport, the following rules have to be observed.
 - Give a written application
 - Sign the School Leaving Register
 - Take a Permission Slip, which has to be shown at the school gate before leaving the campus.
18. Under no circumstance students are allowed to go behind or under the parked vehicles in the school campus. Students are also not allowed to sit in the parked vehicles during school hours. They should not touch the instrument panel of the vehicles.

Every duty is holy and devotion to duty is the highest form of worship.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT (contd...)

19. Any misbehaviour with the driver, conductor, fellow students or teachers in the bus by a child or a parent will not be tolerated. In such cases the school transport facility to the child stands cancelled.
20. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the teacher in the bus. The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience and safety of all bus commuters and is subject to change.
21. The students are responsible for maintaining discipline in the bus. Any serious offence must be reported to the Principal immediately.
22. In case of change in stop and / or bus (of a temporary or permanent nature), the permission for the same has to be sought through a written application.
23. Parents have to ensure that their wards do not go to and from the bus stops unescorted.
24. Parents / Guardians of such students who do not avail the School Transport should report at the School gate 15 minutes before the dispersal to collect their wards.
25. No efforts for the safety of the students are spared but the School will not be held responsible for any road accident in which the buses may unfortunately be involved.
26. Transport charges are to be paid for the complete academic session (April-March). No request to discontinue bus facility during the academic year will be entertained.

HEALTH EDUCATION

Parents are requested to impart Health Education to their children. This is important so that they follow the tips given below :

- a) Maintain personal hygiene such as trimming of nails and being neat on regular basis.
- b) Exercise regularly.
- c) Sleep for at least eight hours daily.
- d) Have a balanced diet.
- e) Drink water which is either boiled or filtered. All students are advised to bring their own water bottles from home.
- f) Avoid consumption of ice-creams, other milk products and eatables from road-side vendors and kiosks.
- g) All children should also be :
 - i) Dewormed at least once every year, on the advice of the family physician.
 - ii) Have a dental and ophthalmic check up once every year by a well qualified dental surgeon and ophthalmologist.

EVALUATION SYSTEM / PROCEDURE

Classes Pre-Nursery to II

The academic year is divided into four terms. There are no formal written examinations for these classes. However, evaluation of the child's progress is done on the basis of day to day performance and in fair evaluation cycles. These theme-based assessments are carried out in various ways which include assessments via worksheets and work done in the notebooks in school and at home, oral assessments via classroom discussions and interactions, and activity assessments that are judged primarily through Activities, Project - activities, Learning Centred activities, creative work etc.

On the basis of the observation, the child would be marked as either **OUTSTANDING / GOOD /PROGRESSING** in the above mentioned areas.

The overall performance of the child will be intimated through the Progress Profile.

Classes III to V

1. Assessment at this stage will be purely qualitative. Judgements of children's activities in various domains will be based on observations made on a regular basis. Apart from academic assessment, health and physical development of the child will also be monitored. Assessment will be done in absolute informal situation making it more flexible.
2. The criterion for the Assessment is concept clarity, problem solving and thinking skills based on Class Work / Written Assessment / day-to-day Classroom interaction / Behaviour / Conversation / Co-curricular activities.
3. The progress of a child will be charted in **two** stages in an Academic Session:
 - First Stage - April to September
 - Second Stage - October to March

Assessment Structure from Classes IX and X for the Session 2026-27

Annual Examination from the coming session will be conducted at the end of the session covering the complete syllabus as follows :

I. Scholastic Area:

- i. Students will be graded in 9 point grading scale.
- ii. Final Result will comprise the following :
 - (a) Annual Examination – 80 marks : Annual Examination will be conducted of 80 marks in each subject, in which a student needs to secure at least 33% mark (27 marks) to qualify in the particular subject.
 - (b) Internal Assessment – 20 marks : Internal Assessment comprises of Periodic Tests of 10 marks, Notebook Maintenance of 5 marks and Subject Enrichment Activity of 5 Marks, out of which a student needs to secure at least 33% mark (7 marks) to qualify in the particular subject.

Examination & Promotion Policy for Classes XI & XII – 2026-27

The Examination & Promotion Policies of Classes XI & XII will be as per the latest CBSE guidelines and norms.

EVALUATION RULES & REGULATIONS

General Rules and Regulations for Examination and Evaluation :

1. Attendance is compulsory for all the tests held during the year, failing which the students will be awarded zero. The student has to appear for the examinations in order to be considered for promotion to the next class.
2. **Retest will not be conducted for a child who is absent for any of the tests conducted during the year.**
3. No early leave will be granted to the child on Assessment days in any case.
4. A minimum attendance of 75% of the total number of working days in each term is compulsory. On medical grounds the attendance will be as per CBSE norms.
5. Students who report late for any of the examinations / assessments will not be given any extra time for answering the question papers.
6. **Unfair Means :** Students using unfair means during any of the examinations (Weekly Test or Assessment) will be awarded zero in that subject. Parents of such students will be called to the school where both parent and child will be asked to give an undertaking that if the same is repeated in future, then the child will be given T.C. without any explanation.
7. There is no provision of conditional promotion and students scoring less than 40% marks in any of the main subjects English, Hindi, Mathematics, Science & Technology and Social Science will be detained in the same class.
8. All types of correction (totalling mistake, unmarked questions, etc.) in the answer scripts should be brought to the notice of the subject teacher concerned on the same day. Any change thereafter will not be taken into account while preparing the final result.
9. Request of Progress Profile before result declaration will not be entertained.
10. Duplicate Report Card will be issued on payment of ₹300/-.
11. The school arranges for students to participate in various competitive examinations conducted at the National level. Students wishing to participate, will have to pay the fee as required by the body conducting these tests. Besides the students will also be required to pay for the travel and boarding.
12. Formative and Summative Assessments will be conducted during the two stages (Mid Term & Final Term) as per the guidelines from CBSE.

Note : In case of any emergency, if the exam is not conducted on the scheduled date it should be noted that the same will be conducted at the end of the examination schedule.

PROJECTS

PROJECT WORK

At MIS Tekari we follow a very progressive and innovative approach towards imparting education to our students. Therefore Project Work is an inherent part of our curriculum so the students learn to experiment, record and present facts.

These projects may be integrated for some subjects as per notification which will follow later.

There is individual and one group project planned in every subject for each term. The projects relate to familiar everyday subjects and focus on active learning rather than learning by rote. The projects emphasize self-exploration and research and also encourage collaborative learning and team effort. Presentation of the project aims at developing the confidence and communication skills of the student.

Please note some of the guidelines given for the projects:

- The project should be neatly handwritten and not typed.
- Parental guidance is solicited but the focus should be on the effort put in by the student himself/herself.
- Teacher will supervise and aid the projects.
- Detailed guidelines about topics and content will be provided.

FORMAT OF THE PROJECT

The project submitted by the students should follow the following format:

- Introduction or Preface
- Body
- This should contain information on the subject as well as methodology used. For young students e.g. Classes II & III, this can be in the form of points.
- The body of the project should reflect the research conducted by the student. This can be illustrated by photos and pictures.
- Emphasis will be on format, logical sequencing as well as neatness.
- The Project Report will be presented by the student followed by question-answer session.


